## Open Book and Board of Review Dates

Open Book will be held on Wednesday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, from 3:00-5:00pm at the Village Hall, where the 2024 assessment roll will be available for public inspection. This provides an opportunity for property owners to review their assessment and discuss any questions or concerns with the Village's assessor.



Board of Review will be held on Thursday, July 10<sup>th</sup> from 3:00-5:00pm. Any Village property owner interested in appealing their 2024 assessment should first contact the Village Assessor, Eric Kleven, at 715-529-1032 and attempt to resolve differences of opinion regarding the assessment prior to appearing at the Board of Review.

## 2025 Pine Street & Lori Court Projects

The Village of Sauk City's 2025 street project has begun. The project will be on Pine Street, from the intersection of Kennedy Street to Bates Street, and both Lori Court cul-de-sacs. The project will be a reconstruction of the roadway with some stormwater upgrades. D.L. Gasser is the contractor on this project, and substantial completion of the project is anticipated to be June 30<sup>th</sup>.

## Compost Pick Up Reminder

Yard waste must be bagged using only biodegradable paper lawn/leaf bags. Grass clippings should never be swept, blown, or raked into the street or gutter, as this can clog the storm sewers.

All other containers, including plastic bags, garbage bags, plastic containers, or similar containers are prohibited. Yard waste in prohibited containers will not be collected at the curb or accepted at the Village Compost Site per Ordinance § 276-12D. Compost site is open 7 days a week, strictly compost only, no brush.

## ENERGY SAVING TIPS

### How can you save more?

#### *Close your window coverings in the summer*

In the summer, the sunlight streaming through your windows heats your home. The sun's heat will make your home less comfortable and make your air conditioner use more energy. Close your window coverings during the day to block the sun's rays and keep your home cooler.

#### *Set your thermostat up in summer*

Air conditioners use a lot of power, so every degree warmer you can tolerate in your house will save you energy and money. On average, for every degree you turn up your thermostat, you save about 3% on your energy bills.

#### *Turn down the thermostat on your water heater*

The temperature on your water heater may be set higher than necessary. Some manufacturers preset water heaters to 140 degrees. Lowering the temperature by at least 10 degrees can save you up to 5% on your water heating costs. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) suggests users to keep the temperature at 120 degrees.

#### *Unplug your second refrigerator or freezer*

Many families keep a second fridge to hold extra drinks or to use in the basement during parties. Most of these refrigerators are at least 10 years old and use a lot of energy. If you have a second fridge, retire it or plug it in only when you really need it.
